



Put your fingers through the holes to play with the Martha and Skits puppets!



# You Can Help

#### Talk Together

Talk with children about their day and anything else they find interesting dinosaurs, cookies, trains.


- Talk with your child about what you are doing at mealtime, bedtime, or anytime. Your child will notice the words you use. He or she will use them, too.
- Learning and using lots of words in their home language makes it easier for kids to learn words in English.


### Read Together
